Well worth a visit but not open weekends

this 1930s French style house was built for the Courtauld Family by the architects John Seely and Paul Paget. Its interior furnishings and design are an interesting example of art deco work with concealed lighting, centralised vacuum cleaning and a loudspeaker system which can be heard all round the house. There are even synchronised art deco clocks.

the attractive veneered panelling uses an assortment of woods including golden aspenwood, sycamore, bird's eye maple, Japanese chestnut and Indian mahogany in the garden herbaceous borders echo the colour and vibrancy of the period

The former canteen has a green marble-tiled factory washroom.

attached to the Savoy Hotel this theatre dates from 1930. The designer used aluminium & silver leaf gilding and multicoloured varnishes. Angular designs are mixed with Chinese, Egyptian and Mexican designs in the carpets, whirlpool ceiling with concealed lighting, the inlaid marble floor and the giant wall panels of Chinese motif reliefs on either side of stage. The Theatre was originally built in 1881 to stage Gilbert and Sullivan operas

when it was built in 1929 by Charles Holden this combined office building and underground station in Portland Stone was the tallest building in London. Both the building reception and the shopping mall retain their art deco style. On the exterior there are 5 reliefs representing the Winds. By Eric Gill, Henry Moore, and others they symbolise the Transport Board's range of responsibilities.

part of the University of London this is another example of Charles Holden architecture. Built in 1932 of Portland Stone it is a striking tower block from outside while inside there are wrought iron features in the Crush Hall and marble walls and floors throughout

once the headquarters of the Daily Express newspaper (when Fleet Street was home to most of Britain's newspapers) this 1932 building is covered with black Vitrolite and clear glass, with chromium strips. The lobby includes plaster reliefs of Industry by Eric Aumonier, lots of silver and gilt including a silvered pendant lamp and an oval staircase.

Dolphin Square

one of largest self-contained residential blocks in Europe this 1937 building is of stacked red brick and contains 1200 flats, an art deco shopping arcade, a hotel with restaurant (Rhodes in the Square) that has the original art deco stairs and handrails and the Clipper Bar & Brasserie. The Square is named after the 'dolphin' pump that was used for drawing water from the nearby River Thames

Grosvenor Estate

this estate was designed by Sir Edwin Landseer Lutyens between 1928 and 1930. It has identical buildings of alternating brick and white stucco chequerboard pattern. Imitation lodges provide access and complete the design

when this underground station was opened in 1939 the statue of an archer by Eric Aumonier was added
