the Gallery of Islamic Art has a selection of carpets :- a handknotted Ardabil Carpet 65ft wide (20m), made in 1539 with central medallion and 16 oval pendants (twin is in Los Angeles) ; a Chelsea Carpet measuring 35ft by 17.5ft (10.7m by 5.4m); examples from the Middle East including two 16th century Persian medallion design; a 16th century Turkish table carpet; a Persian Garden example and Central Asian tribal designs. An extensive range is held in the Textile Study Room but these can only be viewed by appointment

the original (now stored in the archives of the Victoria and
Albert Museum) allows the visitor to appreciate the room's
original design*
