there are examples of Roman & Greek pottery; Iranian; Turkish (16th century Iznik); Korean; Japanese; Chinese (Song and Yuan dynasties); Islamic (ceramics, tiling & earthenware); European (Moorish Spain, Romanesque & Gothic); Italian (Renaissance Maiolica plate); ceramic art; medieval British pottery including Fulham stoneware (including Wedgwood) and Staffordshire pottery; British Art pottery of William de Morgan and the Martin Brothers; French pottery from medieval stoneware to the painted pottery of Picasso and Bernard Palisse; Dutch Delftware; stoneware friezes and cornice decoration - the list is endless

and don't miss the Fakes and Forgeries Collection of furniture, ceramics, metalwork and sculpture from the 19th century onwards, and the Twentieth Century Galleries that illustrate the interweaving of art & industry and the competing claims of different approaches over good design in the fields of furniture, ceramics, glass and metalwork
