Please note:- some places restrict entry and ask for prior application either in writing or by telephone. This is indicated where known. Others may change opening days and hours with little warning – it may be worth checking by phone if they are off the beaten track.

A very brief description of the reason for the choice of site is given but because of space it is not possible to include much detail. Again a telephone call to the site may help you to decide on whether a visit is worthwhile. Remember there may be other items that interest you at the same site.

the reredos (altarpiece) is the carved or painted screen placed above or behind the altar. Often incorporating images of Christ's life, saints and angels it may consist of two panels (diptych) or three panels (triptych) and may vary a great deal in size and ornateness

the Palace has many pieces of woodcarving by Grinling Gibbons (1648-1721) including overmantles and overdoors in the King's Apartments, castellations and mouldings in the Banqueting House and the lovely oak reredos in the Chapel. Gibbons is known for his intricately carved fruit, flowers and cherubs' heads. This reredos has cherubim above drops on either side of a framed oval. The Corinthian pillars & segmental pediment are by the architect, Christopher Wren

this reredos is a memorial to the Pilgrim Fathers - English religious dissenters who established Plymouth Colony in America in 1620 after crossing the Atlantic in the 'Mayflower'. The reredos has columns and flambeaux with an oil painting of the Crucifixion and a stained glass panel of Christ in His Glory

the Jewish equivalent of the reredos is the Ark. In this synagogue it is made of wood in the classical manner with the Ten Commandments written in Hebrew and above in Hebrew the inscription "Know before Whom thou standest". The Ark contains the sacred scrolls of the Pentateuch (the five books of Moses written on parchment in Hebrew)

in the chapel the altar table and sanctuary chairs are made from timber from HMS Temeraire, a ship that fought alongside Lord Nelson's ship 'Victory' at the Battle of Trafalgar in 1805. She was made famous by Turner's 1838 painting 'The Fighting Temeraire' that he composed as she was being taken up river to Rotherhithe to be broken up

the rood screen and reredos were designed in 1892 by the Victorian architect, G F Bodley (1827-1907). It shows Christ & four of the Apostles and two towers with angels, seraphim & two saints

dating from 1680 and made of oak this reredos has Corinthian pilasters with gilded capitals. The two centre panels have the Commandments with cherub's heads above and God's name in Greek & Latin. The curved pediment has a dove with scrolls and flaming urns

built between 1880 and 1884 this was the first new Catholic church in London after the Reformation. It has the third widest nave in Britain after Westminster Abbey & York Minster and is of High Baroque (Italian Mannerist) style with an interior decorated with gold, Siena marble & Venetian mosaics. The reredos in the Lady Chapel is inlaid with precious stones as is the altar. The Oratory is well-known for its music and solemn masses sung in Latin

this church dates from 15th century but was rebuilt in 1867 by Sir Gilbert Scott. It is the burial place of six Archbishops of Canterbury. The reredos is of alabaster with a relief of the nativity, crucifixion and resurrection
