Lords Cricket Ground/MCC Museum

facilities: limited disabled access; library; restaurant and snacks nearby; shop for prints, books, souvenirs and cricket equipment; tours by arrangement

opening: daily except match days. Tours at noon & 14.00 (additional tour at 10.00 during summer) It is advisable to phone to check opening times
admission charge

the museum covers the history and equipment of the sport of cricket. Amongst the memorabilia are bats, balls, bails, an urn containing the Ashes, portraits of famous members and Staffordshire pottery figurines of cricketers. A guided tour is highly recommended. Outside, the gates serve as a memorial to the first-class batsman and bowler William Gilbert Grace (1848-1915) and are carved with the initials WGG and stumps, bails, bat and ball

one of the famous London cricket grounds and HQ of the Surrey County Cricket Club since 1880. The memorial gates celebrate the England and Surrey batsman Sir Jack Hobbs (1882-1963). There is also a statue by Ritchie Walter of another famous England cricketer, Sir Leonard Hutton (1916-1990)

at the present time (Spring 2004) the Vauxhall end of the ground is being demolished to make way for a new stand (backed with a living plant screen) and new hospitality & banqueting facilities. Due for completion May 2005

this Victorian cemetery of 40 acres was originally the 'West of London & Westminster Cemetery' and has some notable graves among its 200,000. One belongs to the cricketer John Wisden (1826-84)

this royal park has facilities for playing football, cricket, hockey, rugby, rounders, netball and softball. Rowing boats can be hired on the lake
