Aimed at the tourist the banquet takes place in the cellars of a former warehouse set in an interesting former dock, now a marina

built between 1893 and 1906 as a music hall, this theatre has been a skating rink, a pickle factory, and a boxing arena before becoming a renowned centre for world dance, opera and musical theatre. It also holds visual arts exhibitions (free admission)

a venue for contemporary art exhibitions by new artists, these studios also hold theatre, cinema and dance workshops

Joy of Life Fountain

this attractive 1963 bronze fountain was erected in memory of Christian Hubert Goetze (1866-1939) an artist who, amongst other works, painted the murals on the staircase of the Foreign and Commonwealth Office. He was a benefactor to Regent's Park. By T B Huxley-Jones it has two young people holding hands and dancing, with four little 'children', in the water from upward shooting jets

the Courtauld Gallery is an integral part of the Courtauld Institute of Art, the oldest centre for the teaching of History of Art in England

this is the largest, most comprehensive city museum in the world. It traces the fascinating story of London from prehistoric times to the end of World War 1. Among its collection can be found costumes & accessories from the late 18th century to 1970 associated with the theatre and other performing arts including ballet

this bronze sculpture of 1971 by David Wynne is entitled 'The Dancers' and shows male and female nudes entwined in a dance. It stands on the lawn at the north end of the gardens

this dance studio offers classes in pole dancing, bellydancing, breakdancing, salsa, hiphop, jazz, ballet, tap or contemporary dance

among the Gallery's collection of paintings by Pierre-Auguste Renoir (1841-1919) is the 'Dancing Girl with Tambourine' painted in 1909. Also on display is Degas's work 'Ballet Dancers' (1890-1900)
