Included are gold necklaces and mirrors from British pre-Roman times; Anglo Saxon remains especially the Sutton Hoo Treasure of gold decorated with inset enamel; the Snettisham Treasure collection of gold and silver rings; the Mildenhall Treasure; the Hoxne Hoard; the Hull Grundy Gift of engraved gems and gold; the Oxus Treasure of gold & silver jewellery and ornaments found in the Near East and dating from 6-4th century BC

a magnificent display of the Crown Jewels of the British monarchy include St Edward's Crown (worn only at Coronations) and the Imperial State Crown made for Queen Victoria and worn on state occasions. Among other outstanding precious items are rings and crosses decorated with many precious jewels, and the Royal

Sceptre that contains the Star of Africa, the largest stone cut from the famous Cullinan Diamond (the largest diamond ever found). The jewels have been kept in the Tower of London since 1327

there is an outstanding display of Italian pietre dure (Florentine hardstones) and glass micromosaics (tiny coloured glass rods secured in adhesive, waxed & polished) in this collection. Used as panels in furniture, on vases and jewellery there are bird and floral motifs, and still-life, landscape and genre scenes. Also amongst the collection are over 200 gold snuffboxes made in Paris, Berlin, London, Dresden & Vienna. Six of them are decorated with jewels and were made for Frederick the Great of Prussia

one of the most prized pieces in the Collection is the Jewish Torah Crown of gold, decorated with precious stones and gold eagles holding bells in their beaks. It is one of only two existing in the world. The Torah Crown motive is used to adorn sacred teaching scrolls of Judaic worship

there is also a fine display of Medieval and Renaissance carved and coloured ivories believed to be one of the largest collections in the country

One of the many intriguing items is the Naseby jewel hatpin thought to date from about 1630. The pin has the figure of a cavalier in the centre and is studded with rubies. History says that it may have been dropped by King Charles II at the Battle of Naseby in ?????
