originally known as No.1 London, Apsley House was built by Robert Adam between 1771 and 1778 for Baron Apsley. It was the home from 1817 to 1852 of Arthur Wellesley, 1st Duke of Wellington, the hero of the Peninsular War & Waterloo and a leading British statesman and Prime Minister. Many of the items on display were collected by the Duke and there are good examples of painted Meissen, 1819 Prussian, Saxon and Austrian porcelain.

there is also a Sevres Egyptian service originally made for Empress Josephine by Napoleon as a divorce present but she rejected it. It was then presented to Wellington by King Louis XVIII in 1818. Another 400 piece Sevres dinner service is decorated with scenes of Wellington's life and was presented by the King of Prussia. Further pieces are painted with topographical views showing Robert Adam's ideas for Aspley House

there is also white porcelain from the Tang Period (618-906) in China; examples of the goods made by Chinese manufacturers for European markets (the Gerard Godfrey Gallery of Chinese Export Art); a lifesize porcelain Goat of Kaendler; items illustrating the development of the European china industry from the Renaissance to the 18th century including the Meissen and Sevres factories; pieces from the Far East especially Japan. There are many more lovely pieces in the different galleries of the museum so allow plenty of time for a visit
