this ship is the floating livery hall of the Honorary Company of Master Mariners and was purchased in 1947. The staircase leading down to the hall (the former engine room) was part of the Isle of Man trading ship 'Viper'

this Victorian Gothic former Midland Grand Hotel closed in 1935 and was then used as railway offices. At the moment it is being converted into a Marriott Hotel with the upper rooms as loft apartments. The grand central staircase winds from ground to upper floors and is one of the finest in the country. It was originally lit by gas and the metal columns housed the gas pipes

the back stairs are an intricate design of ironwork

this house was transformed in the 18th century into a neo-classical villa with a six-columned portico at the front and a 1770 horseshoe staircase with delicate wrought ironwork and brasswork at the back. This was added by the architect, Robert Adam, who also designed the interior.

this is the best place to see Robert Adam's work. All the rooms are as he designed them - ceilings, walls, doorcases, doors, handles, carpets, mirrors, furniture. The main staircase is of neo-classical design with a fine iron balustrade and delicate stucco decoration. It sits under a replica of the ceiling painting by Rubens - the original had been destroyed in a fire in 1949

built in 1405 this is the only medieval town belfry in England. The top, for fine panoramas of the town and cathedral, is accessible by 93 very small spiral steps
