this Royal Palace is adorned with many famous tapestries. Various rooms have works from series such as the Acts of the Apostles (Brussels), the Story of Abraham (Flemish 1540s by Van Orley) and the Story of Alexander the Great (Gobelin 18th century).

others include a 1540 Brussels tapestry of the Labour of Hercules and the Triumph of Bacchus commissioned by King Henry VIII for Whitehall Palace; five early 16th century ones showing scenes from Virgil's Aeneid; and four more from the 16th century representing the conflict between the Virtues and Vices. There is a Raphael in the King's Apartments and small armorial tapestries with the arms of Cardinal Wolsey and King Henry VIII in the Great Watching Chamber. In all a feast for the eyes!

this museum's fine and applied art collection is one of the best in the world and it is a fitting place to display a collection of tapestries. Medieval examples include four from Flanders illustrating the 6th Duke of Devonshire's Gothic Hunts and dated between 1426 and 1450.

seven 'cartoons' (designs) by Raphael for tapestries ordered for the Sistine Chapel were bought by King Charles I in 1623 and have been on loan from the Royal collection since 1865. The word 'cartoon' comes from the Italian 'cartone' literally 'a large sheet of paper'. The original design would be reversed on the tapestries because the weavers cut the 'cartoon' into strips and pricked along the outlines with pins. If you look carefully you can still see the holes.

other tapestries come from famous manufacturers such as Mortlake, Soho, Fulham & Lambeth in Britain and from Gobelin and Aubusson on the Continent. Chinese tapestry is rich with birds, beasts, dragons and flowers
